

Harvey takes the reins at LMCCC

Robert Harvey, the deputy executive director for capital planning and construction at the Lower Manhattan Construction Command Center (LMCCC), will act as executive director of the organization until a full-time replacement for Charles Maikish has been found.

Lower Manhattan Development Corporation (LMDC) chairman Avi Schick and Deputy Mayor Daniel Doctoroff announced the appointment earlier this week following Maikish's announcement that he plans to leave to pursue other opportunities.

Instrumental in helping draft the executive orders that led to the creation of the LMCCC, Maikish took the agency from concept to full functionality in his two years

at the helm. Under his leadership, the Enforcement Task Force was put in place to coordinate all the city and state agencies involved in the rebuilding and address traffic and quality-of-life issues in Lower Manhattan.

"The Command Center is now fully operational and is fulfilling its mission: to facilitate the construction of 60 projects below Canal Street, mitigate the impact on residents and businesses," Maikish said in announcing his departure.
